ORDINANCE NO. 2020-07

**AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BID FOR THE 2020 SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT AND ALL ACTS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT SUCH PROJECT**

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Meadville, Missouri as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board awards a bid on behalf of the City for the 2020 Sewer System Improvements at a price of \$1,241,820.00 from David E. Ross Construction Co. The successful bidder is found to be the lowest, best, and most responsive bidder.

**Section 2.** The Board of Aldermen authorizes and directs the Mayor of the City to execute the contract on file with the City Clerk and any other documents the Mayor deems necessary or proper to effectuate such contract and authorizes the expenditure of the funds for such project.

**Section 3.** The project approved by this Ordinance is subject to the requirements of Section 292.675, RSMo, which requires all contractors or subcontractors doing work on the Project to provide and require its on-site employees to complete, a ten (10) hour course in construction safety and health approved by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration ("OSHA") or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations which is at least as stringent as an approved OSHA Program. The training must be completed within sixty (60) days of the date work on the project commences. On-site employees found on the worksite without documentation of the required training shall have twenty (20) days to produce such documentation.


**Section 4.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.


**Section 5.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Board of Aldermen hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

**Section 6.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

This bill was read in full in the open meeting two times prior to its final passage.
